Easter



In our Sunday morning meeting on 3rd March, we prayed and re-commissioned the team who will help to lead the project.



interested to come and get involved, because it's a wonderful way to spend a Tuesday or Friday morning.



there is a growing need for more people to be ready to welcome everyone who comes.

Some of our team love being on the door welcoming and pointing the way to our meeting, some welcoming families, new and regular, while others are around in the main hall offering conversation as people arrive, guiding visitors to the refreshments and helping everyone find a seat – quite a job these days. Others love serving tea and coffee and making sure each of us is ready for the meeting. There is a part of everyone.

We are particularly short of car park welcomers – you need to be able to direct car drivers to a parking spot and help the people in those cars to arrive safely in the centre! You will need a good warm, waterproof coat but we provide a high vis jacket to make sure

you are visible.



What is pastoral care?

Participating in pastoral care has deepened our commitment to caring for others in line with

Christian values. Pastoral care involves love, empathy, support, and community building, extending beyond assistance to personal connection and affirmation.

Love, exemplified by Christ, forms the basis of pastoral care, essential for believers to reciprocate.

Attributes include active listening, presence, and guiding without judgment, especially in everyday situations.

However, pastoral care presents challenges like vulnerability and



confronting truths. Yet, these challenges foster growth and deeper connections.

Embracing love in pastoral care enriches lives and communities, as seen in the early

church (Acts 4:44-46), emphasizing loving others without expecting reciprocity.

It's a profound way to connect and discover compassion within ourselves,

urging everyone to extend care not out of obligation but for mutual enrichment.

I was


looking at how my life had changed since retirement and what direction my life would go in now.

Carer support group

We recognise that within church we have a lot of people involved in caring for relatives and we've been thinking about how we can support those within church that are involved in caring for loved ones. We're aware that this takes a toll and can be draining and that

chatting with others who are in a similar position can be really helpful/ encouraging. We have set up a WhatsApp group for those involved in caring for loved ones, so we can pray/support each other and have social get togethers (about every 2 months). Caring looks different for each of us, some live and care full time for someone, for some it's regularly checking in and supporting a loved one, but we all share that emotional burden of caring for someone.

I joined this group because I'm looking after elderly parents, albeit from 70 miles away as my wife and I have moved around a lot with work. It's a once every-so-often relaxed meet up.

For me this group is a chance to learn as well as speak. Some are experiencing different issues with their loved one/s, but others have been further along similar paths which I can see myself having to tread in the future.

I'm not a massive crowd person but felt that I could do with the support above

lack of comfort and besides, it's also not a crowd, I'd say 20 people or so.

Caring for elderly, often confused or even ungrateful parents can be a real drain on resources, for me that



doesn't always mean only petrol, time and money – it's the exhaustion that can take place when the care services and authorities just don't get it (or are too busy to want to get it!).

I'd recommend this group to anyone who just wants a sympathetic ear or

who wants to try and put together a new plan of action with the various services by listening to how others have done it.

If students are already connected to one of our LifeGroups before they go, that group will often continue to support them throughout their university career.


We also have a Student Link person – who will contact our students from time to time, to check in with them and check they are doing ok.





Bob is on the move. (not from Ashwood, so don't worry)

As many of you will know, for the last four years I have been working for Youth for Christ, originally as their Missions & Evangelism Director, and then due to a raft of redundancies this time last year, I moved to be Head of Income Development. I have been incredibly privileged to have spent most of my life now seeking to share Jesus across Britain, and I have only been able to do it because I know I have so many faithful people cheering me on, praying for me, and supporting the ministry.

So, firstly, I want to say a massive thank you to Ashwood Church, who have been supporting me as one of your mission partners, both prayerfully and financially, as well as so many of you here at Ashwood who do this on a personal level too.

The News

At the end of February, I finished my role at Youth for Christ, and have now taken up a new position as Chief Executive Officer for RMS (Rural Mission Solutions).

Who is RMS?

Rural Mission Solutions is a Christian charity that specialises in serving rural churches throughout Britain. RMS isn't



just a charity; it's a beacon of hope, tirelessly dedicated to nurturing village churches across Britain. Our mission is clear: to empower these churches to embrace their communities, radiate God's love, and share the transformative message of hope found in Jesus Christ. With decades of experience, we possess the expertise to craft culturally relevant strategies that resonate deeply and effect change.

Our 'dream' is to see visible, vibrant, credible, and caring Christian communities in every village. This might well be the local village church, or an informal group of Christians



drawn from the local churches. They will be people engaged with and in their local village, and with a heart to serve the wider community, rather than self-interest. Their mission will be to show God's love for all and to share the life-changing good news of Jesus Christ.

We are a small staff team, consisting of me as the new CEO, an Operations Manager, a Mission Adviser, and a CofE Network Adviser, although we have a huge amount of potential heading into the future under new leadership, with 3 new appointments across the next 9 months (funding dependent).

What do RMS do?

We offer a process that is interactive. designed to suit each local situation and led by an experienced facilitator. Most importantly, we start by carefully and prayerfully listening to understand your current situation, looking at your strengths and weaknesses and then we explore what resources your church might already have. It is important that as many church members participate and actively support the process, which then involves generating ideas and determines the most appropriate course of action. This is followed by implementing that plan into action and then evaluating its success. Once this has been completed, the final step is to repeat the cycle again without losing momentum.

We are aware of how most village churches are under-resourced, and as our heart is to encourage small village churches, so our consultations and individually tailored mission solutions for rural churches are free!

How could your support help?

RMS was established 35 years ago and

has a mass of potential as we head into the future, and as we know, the harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few, so we will do our best to serve the 20 million people within rural communities, and to seek to help them to find and follow Jesus for themselves. Not only do we have potential to impact rural areas across Britain, with one of our team based locally, this means a strategic priority for us will be the rural areas surrounding Nottinghamshire & Derbyshire.

The charity is funded entirely by donations from individuals and churches, and I would love it if you would prayerfully consider whether you might be able to support me, and RMS into the future. 

Whatever we face, we have the GOOD NEWS that we have a personal saviour who loves us and who will fight for us no matter what. We can have hope.

Allan's path to writing

My mother became a Christian in her mid-70's. Dad was uninterested.

When mum died years later, my 93-year old father was left alone at home.

Although I wanted to share my faith with him, I knew he wouldn't listen.



Instead, I

wrote a booklet especially for him "Good News in our Later Years" —
which he could read at his own pace
and in his own space. His spiritual
journey began, culminating in an
amazing conversion 3 years later —
months before he died. Dad's
experience convinced me that there
was a wide-spread need to present the

gospel to specific age-groups or circumstances – prophetic evangelism. Other booklets followed:

"Young People and Parents", "The Retired and Lonely", "Strangers on the Street", "Those facing Cancer or walking with Dementia". The ministry grew. At present between 4,000 and 5,000 publications are used by churches and evangelists every year.

The "Loneliness" booklet addresses the universal deep-seated need to be accepted, valued, understood and loved. A healthy church goes some way to counteract loneliness, by offering sincere love and genuine friendships.

But it needs God to square the circle. Through a living, personal and fulfilling relationship with Jesus, we discover a

wonderful Father who breaks the curse of our deep-seated loneliness by completely knowing us, valuing us and unconditionally loving us.

I didn't get this net, I would have to go hungry.' said Kamona, whose family is suffering the effects of changing climate and rising costs in Bangladesh.

In Bangladesh, where Kamona and her family live, 35 million people don't have enough food to survive. Floods and

Over the last few months I have found myself deeply moved to pray for Open Doors and the many churches around the world who are suffering persecution. Open Doors supports Christians in more than 70 countries who are risking their lives to follow Jesus. They do this by supplying Bibles, providing emergency relief and helping persecuted believers stand strong for the long-term. In the UK and Ireland, Open Doors helps the church to pray, give and speak out for those who share our faith but not our freedom.

Each year they produce a World Watch List, of where Christians face the most extreme persecution and they presented this years list to a group of MP's on 17th January. 'Profound', 'powerful', 'unforgettable' are some of the terms used, by some of the 101 MPs, to convey the impact of what they heard about our persecuted family worldwide. I continue to pray for our

MPs to make their voice and our voice heard in parliament to implement the recommendations from Open Doors.

You can also see how you can get involved, in prayer and other actions as well as reading more stories like one about Sara from Iraq (See. Change. for persecuted women and girls. When I read Sara's story from Iraq, there are two things that really grabbed my attention. One is the remarkable complexity of the persecution of Christian women around the world. The other is that nothing is impossible for God. No persecution is too complex for Jesus to overcome.


