



How did I find joining a LifeGroup?

I was rather nervous at first, not really knowing what to expect. Which I soon learned was not necessary at all, as they are a lovely bunch of people, very welcoming and made me feel very comfortable right away.

What's struck me?

The groups openness and willingness to share, making for a comfortable environment, which helped me come out of my shell a bit and be more vulnerable, which is not a strength of mine. I even found myself praying out loud, which is something I never do in large groups. The dynamic is beautiful, each person brings their own little spice, making for fun and interesting perspectives for the topics each week.

Why would I encourage others to join?

For me, who has been a Christian since a child, it can be easy to be complacent and stagnate in church life. The importance of getting together to share testimonies can renew one's faith. Joining a life group, gives you a chance to meet members of the church, get to know them, which I think helps the church grow closer together.





Its fair to say that this course is for those who want the best for their marriage. Its not necessarily for those having difficulties, its more learning about how to get the most out of your relationship.

It certainly helped us, maybe to understand each other a little more, to be more considerate and we learnt new things about one another (mostly good). We would recommend it!

Singleness and the Church

addressing within church.



It's important to recognise that some people are single by choice, but some people aren't. We have people within Ashwood that are bereaved, some that are divorced, some that have never been married. Some are young and single, some older, some are ok about it, some find it really tough. Especially on a Sunday when people are sat in their 'family units', it can be hard for those who are single to know 'where do I sit?' 'where do I belong?'. We want to make sure that we as a church address the topic of singleness carefully, ensuring we love, validate and empower those who are single to be all that God has called them to be and to make them feel part of our church family unit.

Singleness - A gift or a struggle? Or both at times? Too often in church culture, we're inclined to idolize marriage and downplay singleness. But those who enjoy and steward the gift of singleness remind us that Jesus is enough, and nothing else can truly satisfy.

We need this reminder - this is something we need to be ok at

Singleness: Gangrene or a Gift?

Chris shares a bit of her experience...

Singleness can include a wide variety of situations which may be chosen or involuntary. I am glad that I was asked to tackle this topic. I bring the experience of an almost three decade marriage and subsequent singleness

so I've tasted both statuses and they both have their advantages and disadvantages.

Sometimes people believe that changing their status will be the magic cure to life's problems. A status is not a solution but a situation. Changing status does not bring a miracle cure to loneliness or relationship difficulties.

When God drip fed the phrase



“gangrene or gift” into my mind as I woke up one morning I didn’t at first have a clue what it was about. Then I realised he was giving me thoughts for writing this. How we view our status will affect how we deal with it. If we think of ‘singleness’ as a problem to fix then maybe we see it as ‘gangrene’ – something that is destructive, creates problems and needs to be fixed. But Jesus was single! So there cannot be anything inherently wrong in being single!



I love that at Ashwood there is love for all, and singles are not

made to feel inferior in any way.

I wonder if we had the chance to ask Jesus about singleness while on earth what he would have had to say about it. We don’t know but what we do know is that he was about His Father’s business. We may have a status we want or we may not like it but focussing on ‘our Father’s business’ will help us to focus on our purpose less than our comfort. God looks after our comfort as we look to him to guide to walk in His ways in life.

There’s many other things I could say but for now my encouragement would be to focus on our IDENTITY in Christ because that will make the largest difference to how well we deal with either status whether married or single.

Children and Young People

We are passionate about children and young people! We want them to grow up in an environment where they can learn about Jesus and understand God's love for them. We want to equip our children and young people to meet Jesus and have a life long relationship with him.

Here are some of the great examples of ways we have been able to invest in the lives of children and young people with the money you have given. Every gift, small or large, makes a difference.

Since April 2023 we have:

- Run and resourced four Friday Night Takeaway (FNT) events for school years 1 to 6 (FNT is a great night of fun, games, music, food and stories. Each event enables children to learn more about Jesus). The next FNT is on Friday 9th February 2024
- Run and resourced two holiday clubs (Easter holidays and October half term) for school years 1 to 6 (Each holiday club has a different theme which explores different aspects of life with a positive message and story from the Bible)
- Run our Sunday morning 'Earthshakers' sessions for ages 2 to 14
- Given 'Graduation Packs' for the young people 'graduating' from Earthshakers
- Given Baptism gifts for the



young people who have taken the decision to be baptised

- Given gift bags to our young people heading off to university
- Run social events for young people including 'Colour Run' and 'E-Fest'.
- Facilitated training opportunities for our Children and Youth Teams
- Hosted our Elevate youth sessions on Sunday evenings
- Refurbished our Youth 'Drop In' room and run weekly Youth Drop In sessions
- Invested in Elevate Refresh (our Youth weekend away for school years 6 to age 18) event.



The next Elevate Refresh will take place from 22nd to 24th March 2024. (We subsidise the weekend to keep the costs as low as possible.)

It is so important to keep our children and young people connected and engaged with Jesus. Thank you for the money you give which helps us to try and do this. Everything we do is connected to our mission to help people find and follow Jesus!

I believe when we are hosting we are actually showing God's Love in a tangible way. When we are hosting we meet a variety of different people coming through our doors. People are coming to meet friends or make




new friends and I hope that by showing our respect, kindness and God's Love, they will feel welcome.



"Open up, ancient gates. Open up, ancient doors and let the King of Glory enter..." - We can give praise and thanks that Jesus is our King of Glory!



All sessions and evenings are 6 - 7.30pm at the Ashwood centre and open for all young people in year 6 – age 18.

Our most important goal in life should be – Seeking God’s Kingdom first and then all the other things will be given! This means putting God first, before all things we want to chase after. Before all the goals that we want to set for ourselves. Because the things that are important to us and the things we base our life around, will also be the things we base our goals and dreams around.

As we build up to our RFRESH youth weekend away at the end of March we will be looking at the signs and wonders of Jesus and what we can learn from them today.

At Our Elevate.Yth CoGroups in November we continued our radical.YTH series and we were looking at God’s word. One definition of the word “radical” is: “relating to or affecting the fundamental nature of something.” God speaks in radical terms, we know this because when He speaks, the fundamental nature of things change. If we’re going to be a radical youth, we need to listen to and apply the radical words of God.

CoGroups are back in January and February. Our CoGroups operate like our main church lifegroups but for young people. The aims are to create time and space where young people can grow and develop friendships, explore more about the Christian faith, get to know Jesus, have opportunities for spiritual and personal growth, explore their gifts and talents together.

We ended 2023 with our second social evening of this academic year with a festive themed evening of YTH vs. Leader. Going into the evening the leaders were winning, however by the end of the night the young people took the victory to bring the scores all level

At a recent Pray First we read together Psalm 130:5 AMP *"I wait patiently for the Lord, my soul (expectantly) waits, and in His words do I hope."*, and in the NLT *"I am counting on the LORD; yes, I am counting on him. I have put my hope in his word."* There are a number of situations that I am counting on the Lord to do what he said he would do. I'm counting on him to do what I can't do. I'm counting on him to do what I don't know about to bring about what he said he would do.

These thoughts reminded me of one of the things that Joe Gisbey spoke about on the Sunday morning of our 50th



Celebration weekend: **"this is the year of breakthrough, of doors opening"**. I keep hearing these words and praying over this phrase, in my own life and over other people's situations. I wanted to share it to encourage you to keep praying, to keep pressing into the presence of God. It's not time to stop asking. It's time to speak out what God has said and trust that he will do what he has said.

God is saying **"Ashwood Church, this is the year of doors of breakthrough for you"**. As you step into this Jubilee, this is the year where there are doors that would not open, would not budge, this is year when God is going to open those doors. It says in Revelation *"Behold I have an open door in the heavens before you"*. Things you've prayed for, things you've longed for, even things you've stopped praying for because it's too painful to carry on praying for, God says the things you used to pray for I am about

to answer it. The thing you used to hold out hope for, I am about to do it. There are also going to be some doors that God's going to close as well.

A door of itself is not important. We have all sorts of doors, we have

ornate doors, we have very, very simple doors but essentially all that a door is, is something either provides or denies access. It moves us from one atmosphere into another....

This is the year of breakthrough, open doors for breakthrough, open doors for businesses in this room. This is a year of breakthrough, open doors for marriages in this room. What before you have thought, what you have

longed for, what you have tried and God is saying, I'm about to open the door.

There are some doors that you've opened and you've known that you've allowed the enemy in and it's caused destruction and it's caused distractions which is almost as dangerous and it's caused you to lose focus on God has for you. This is the year when God is going to close some of those doors as well. He is the one who opens doors no one can open and he is the one who closes doors that nobody can open....

I believe God's saying: It is Time to refocus and keep your eye on (Him). Don't get so enamoured by what is happening around you right now



because if you do then you are going to get knocked off course. Keep your eye on what has God said. What has God said to you? What has he said?

Because if God has said it, no man is able to stop it. If God has said it, there is nothing in heaven, on earth or under the earth that is able to stop God from doing what he has declared to you. It's time to speak it out. Joe Gisbey 1st October 2023



Update - Fostering adventure

Hi Ashwood Family

Back in July, I wrote a bit for the Ashwood News about our plans going forward for fostering. Here is an update!

Some of you will remember our plan to buy a bigger house with help from the local authority. That is still the plan! It's not been an easy journey these last 6 months. We have asked a few times 'Is this really what God said?'

BUT - God is always faithful to His promises.

I was reading in Lectio one morning about the birth of John the Baptist and Zechariah's declaration of faithfulness at the end of his enforced silence. He chose not to speak words of disappointment about the journey, but words of clarity and what he had learned in that time. This last 6-12 months has felt for me like a time of exile, silence and limitation at many points - but like Zachariah the things that I have learnt, the ways I have grown in faith, in humility as I have leant on God are so much greater than the struggle.

I have been receiving counselling throughout the whole of this process and it has been so invaluable. A lot of

what I have learned is about control. About being in control of the things I have been given control of, but also being able to let go of what I can't control, and let God take care of those things. All of those times the negotiations with the council have gotten more tricky, my natural inclination is to push harder to try and make it happen. But what I learned is that just letting go, giving it God and trusting in his promises, his hope and his future is the best way.

There was one particular week in this process where I stopped emailing people and just trusted God. During that week, we sold our house, and the house we are now buying dropped in price meaning we could afford to buy it, we finalised the agreements with the council and received a request to have a new child, who is now living with us!

God is so amazing, and we have just seen so many times him just meet us in our lowest points, and looking back we can just see him carrying us, and getting us ready for what is next.

Throughout this whole process we have kept coming back to Isaiah 54, about enlarging our tent. We feel like what we are doing is just that... spreading out and thinking big, getting prepared for our growing family. The context of that passage is Israel not

seeing the promises fulfilled that she was expecting. God is saying hang on in there, get prepared, keeping worshipping. Don't hold back - one day you will forget this time and just see what God has done. The start of the passage talks about tents, spreading out pegs. But by the end it's talking about a city built with precious stones. What an amazing picture, as we are faithful with stretching out our tent pegs and doing what we can to make room for God's children, he has in mind a strong and beautiful fortress - so much more than a tent! Even in the pain, what God has in mind is more than what we are imagining!

Some of the things we have experienced and are experiencing we believe are a prophetic vision of what could be in Ashwood too, as we all are obedient in getting ready for growth and enlarging our tent... exciting!



SO WHAT NOW?

We are expecting to move to our new house, sometime during February. After that we will be ready to welcome two more young people into our care, making three in total.

As we have said before, we can't do this alone. We are so grateful for all of our Ashwood family who have prayed with us, supported us and helped us.

We are so fortunate to be part of a church who not only loves us but also has fostering in it's vision.

We would love for you to consider if there are ways you can support us, here are some ideas:

- 1) We will need some new bedroom furniture. wardrobes and chests of drawers.
- 2) Ongoing support with household tasks. It will take some getting used to a bigger house to clean and extra laundry etc!
- 3) **BABYSITTING.** We are super grateful to Joel and Bethan who have agreed to be regular babysitters. However we'd love to get another couple of people. With three children in placement it would be good to have people who could babysit in pairs, so perhaps a couple or two friends. There is a

simple vetting process for this. The local authority will pay for babysitting so it can be a way to earn a little extra money.

4) **Friends and Family support care.** People who know us can register as carers to have our children (or one of them) for weekends or holidays to help

us have a break. You do have to become a registered carer for this so there is some training and a more in depth process to go through, but you won't be asked to provide breaks for any other foster carers.

Thanks so much Ashwood, we are so grateful for you!



'You will possess their land because I will give it to you as your possession - a land flowing with milk and honey.'


4. Pray the Declaration Prayer:



Supporting Men's Wellbeing



We recognise that maintaining good mental health and wellbeing are so important for everyone, but in particular it is so important to make sure men aren't missed. We know that we ALL need pastoral care (whether we're struggling or not) and we all need to feel heard and accepted. Research has shown that men often feel unable to express their true emotions often due to stigma e.g. real men don't cry. Whilst we are addressing this a lot more in society, we still have a long way to go. Especially given that 1 in 3 men in the UK have experienced suicidal thoughts as a result

of stress (Mental Health Foundation). Guys please know it's ok not to be ok - it's ok to show your emotions - it's ok to talk about how you're really feeling!

We hear from some guys this month who are comfortable sharing their own experience/encouragements....

Today men's mental health is under stress. Sometimes we have been expected to just to "man-up" if circumstances seem overwhelming or desperate. I believe because of modern day wokeness, male dignity is under attack more than any time in my lifetime. Often confused as to how you are supposed to act, we guys can retreat from any situation that might be misconstrued or

misunderstood. It can leave us feeling powerless.

My own experience has taught me that walking closer to Jesus and allowing His healing touch on my emotions,



brings a peace and an understanding of others. I attended counselling many years ago which enabled me to understand myself better and why I had certain reactions to things. As the saying goes; "Knowing the truth sets you free"

Having this dedicated time empowered me to have greater empathy towards others and see that we are all broken people, trying to find peace in the pieces. Jesus said: "I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners".

He intends to bring peace and freedom so we can be whole people, filled with his love and empowered to overcome. Coming to Him without the feeling that

you have to get it all right, frees us up to be real and know that He loves us as we are, with a plan to make us into the "good and faithful servants" He's looking forward to welcoming home.

It's just not true. Men do cry...or they should be encouraged to. There's something in our culture that encourages us men to 'man up' and not to talk about feelings or mood. No wonder male suicide rates are so high - feelings about not coping, of not living up to some image of man, build up with nowhere to go.

I always knew that my mind worked differently to others, but I had, or at least I thought I had, mastered the art of behaving like others (masking) so that I fitted in, despite the mental anguish, pain and anxiety this would cause me. So a diagnosis of Aspergers Syndrome or Autism level 1 as it's now called at the age of 52 initially came as a great relief. I now understood me better. This soon changed into feelings of incompleteness and being defective. How can God love me and work through me if I'm defective?

Enter COVID and as a charity fundraiser I was one of the 10% of my colleagues not furloughed. I was working all hours, not to fundraise for nature conservation projects as normal,

but to keep the lights on and my colleagues in post. This pressure led to my mental health going into sharp decline and mental burnout. I was having regular suicidal thoughts. Thankfully I was 'man enough' to seek help. I had two courses of therapy, during the middle of which I had a lightbulb moment: they were basically teaching the Biblical principles of taking every thought captive and of casting my cares on Jesus.

I'm in a much better place now. I recognise that I am, as the Bible says, wonderfully made and unique, even though I don't always feel I am. I still have autism. I still get anxious and depressed at times. But I know that God has a plan for me, that despite how 'defective' I might think I am, He is more than capable of using me to help build His kingdom here on earth. So my advice to all men is don't bottle things up. Seek help. It really is the most 'man' thing to do.

that at some point, you will reach the end which provides, light, relief and hopefully a fulfilling destination.

However, whilst there is light, there are times in life when you are in a very dark tunnel and no matter how much you try you cannot get out into the light. Well that is what I have experienced over several years and whilst there is progress, there are also times when stuff just pulls you back.

I’ve been there and continue that journey and as said, even when progress is made, another thought or rumination just pulls you and down you go. Being in this tunnel is not nice and can be a lonely place. You can only tell someone a few times how you are feeling before you become (in my view) a broken record or, you see people swerving you because they know what will be said. So, having painted a very dull picture I want to bring some hope into this short piece.



No matter how you are feeling in terms of Anxiety and Depression – talk to a close friend(s) who you can trust, ask them to pray for you, go out for a coffee, seek medical attention, do not be afraid of that. Engage with a counselling service or talking therapy.

I have done all these and it does make a difference. My resolve in life is to be

the best, Husband, Father, Son, Dog Walker, and most of all a Child of the living God. There are many songs and verses from God’s word the Bible and just want to share the following lines with you.

Therefore, since we are surrounded by such a great cloud of witnesses, let us

throw off everything that hinders and the sin that so easily entangles. And let us run with perseverance the race marked out for us, 2 fixing our eyes on Jesus, the pioneer and perfecter of faith. Hebrews 12


Men's Socials

The next men's food night is on Wednesday 31st January at Wetherspoon's The Regent, Kirkby in Ashfield starting around 7:15pm.






At Ashwood, we strive to create a culture of care and to support people pastorally to the best of our abilities. Some issues however are so complex and deep that they may require additional support.

MENOPAUSE

Many reading the word “menopause” will already either begin to feel embarrassed or giggle - but there will be some that are deeply relieved that it is being talked about! The menopause impacts women in a complex variety of ways and, of course, this can have a knock on impact on those around them as well.

We are beginning to become more confident in society about talking about it - and it's something we need to be ok talking about within church. Some women suffer terribly with the change, affecting them physically in all sorts of ways including their memory but also affecting their emotions and their mood. There are a variety of treatments and support available and it's important that women feel comfortable to share their experience.

Perimenopause (the stage before menopause) can be a particularly difficult time for women, both physically and psychologically. Mental health issues – such as anxiety, depression, fluctuations in mood, and fatigue can really affect a woman's quality of life and in turn impact those around her.

Helen shares her experience...

Recently, there seems to be a lot more recognition and acceptance of the difficulties we ladies experience in menopause but it can still be a troubling time. Our symptoms are so varied, its often tricky to know what's expected at this time of life.

My symptoms started a couple of years ago and included the hot flushes, fatigue, aches and pains and changes in my womb for which I underwent lots of investigation. It was the low mood however that affected me the most as it was something I'd never experienced before. It was a tough time for me and my family. HRT patches definitely helped, it was a huge relief when the

mood lifted (for Matt in particular). I read a few books on the menopause, it certainly helped but I'm really none the wiser.

Everyone's experience is so different! It does help to chat to others who are in the same boat. I know there are a few ladies in church who are navigating this change and it's good to share the burden with one another. If anyone is struggling, I would be more than happy to listen and share and helpful tips I may have picked up. Would be good to encourage each other and pray together.

Sallie shares her experience...

My menopause journey was very surprising. Everyone tells you that you will get mood swings and hot sweats, but I didn't find them that bad. My issues started with sleepless nights and led into anxiety and brain fog.

No-one can explain how it feels to have words drop out of your head, to forget what you were talking about, mid-sentence, or to all of a sudden have panic attacks when doing normal tasks.

I genuinely felt like I was going mad! I had always prided myself in my memory, especially for dates and numbers, but all of a sudden, I was forgetting key dates and missing appointments. I realized I needed to write everything down. My motto now is "if it isn't written down, it isn't happening". My phone has become my lifeline, not for scrolling through social media, but for reminding me to do things at a certain time, and in some instances how to do things that I have done all my life, but now can't remember.

I have withdrawn into myself in so many ways, avoiding conversations with people and social situations, which has greatly impacted me and my friendship group.

I often have feelings of failure / dread.

The biggest thing I have learnt through this journey is to have grace: Grace for myself, to treat myself with patience and kindness when I am having a bad day, and grace with others who may be going through the same thing. I have become much more self-aware, knowing I will have to repeat a task over and over again before I remember how to do it or understand it. I have learnt to rely on apps:

- **"Loona"** has helped calm my addled brain and allowed me to fall asleep
- **"Calm"** has helped me to relax,
- **"Finch"** has enabled me to schedule self-care and encouraged me to be kind to myself,
- **"Todoist"** has helped me keep track of things that need doing.

I would really encourage anyone who is struggling in any way, not just through menopause, to try various different apps to find the one that helps you the most.

But most of all, being kind to each other; it is easy to see someone who appears to have it all together, but we never know what is going on under the surface.

Nurturing Faith in Toddlers

Encouraging children in faith is so important! The earlier you start the easier it will be for them to understand and acknowledge that they have a heavenly father who cares so deeply for them.

I encourage my daughter by reading age appropriate Bible stories, recapping on the stories afterwards and

occasionally creating crafts relating to the story. Christian pop-up story books really motivate, excite and encourage younger children to want to learn more about God's word. Praying together is so important, it helps children grow in their relationship with God and it also teaches discipline e.g if you do something wrong you ask for forgiveness from your heavenly father. Praying together highlights your own





faith and really encourages your child to become more prayerful as they are growing into their faith.

Christian children songs, programmes and rhymes are positive ways you can encourage faith in children, they will be learning God's word and having fun at the same time!

Nurturing Faith in Tids

We've found that being part of church has meant that people demonstrate through their daily interactions and service to each other and Christ how to deal with the daily challenges life throws at them. As church family I

believe it is all of our responsibilities to demonstrate our own faith to the next generation. By doing so it will ensure that we all play our part in encouraging the faith of everyone within our church family.

Nurturing Faith in Teenagers

As a mum of 3 teenage daughters (17,16,14) guiding and training them in teachings of Christ and developing their own faith is a challenge.

music they are listening to. It can bring so much confusion on

identity, problems with building relationships and embracing the uniqueness of who they are.

As the scriptures say *"train a child up in the way they should go and when they are old they will not depart from it"*

Proverbs 22:6, this isn't about just telling them, it's about showing them with our own actions/behaviours and providing them that safe space to make mistakes and learn from them without judgement or condemnation.

They are watching us all the time and learning. When we realise our children are a gift from God and not our property it takes the weight off. We know His word says he will never leave us nor forsake us and he goes before us and leads our steps. Everyday the world brings its own



challenges but we have faith and know that His word never changes.

We have experienced our own difficulty in navigating the teenage years. It has been a very tough challenge and very easy to overthink, catastrophise and lean on our own understanding, but just as Abraham did, we have to surrender our Isaacs to God and know that He is working for our good. Asking God for help and support, praying together and when they don't want to engage, praying for them and then standing back and letting God do what only He can. Evangelism isn't just for us to do outside of the home, it begins in the home. Giving teenagers that space to share how they feel and their opinions on things makes them feel heard and it also then enables you to find out things that you can then use in your prayers, our job isn't to "fix" absolutely everything when it goes wrong but it is showing them that life is a journey of developing our character but God is always there. Sharing with them when you have received an answered prayer and having fun together.

Being over protective and trying to shield them from life is not helpful, if anything it will do more harm. They need to understand the good and the bad and learn to lean on the Lord

themselves, then they will see their own prayers answered. Parenting is hard but God put our children in our lives to be good role models to them and to love them.
