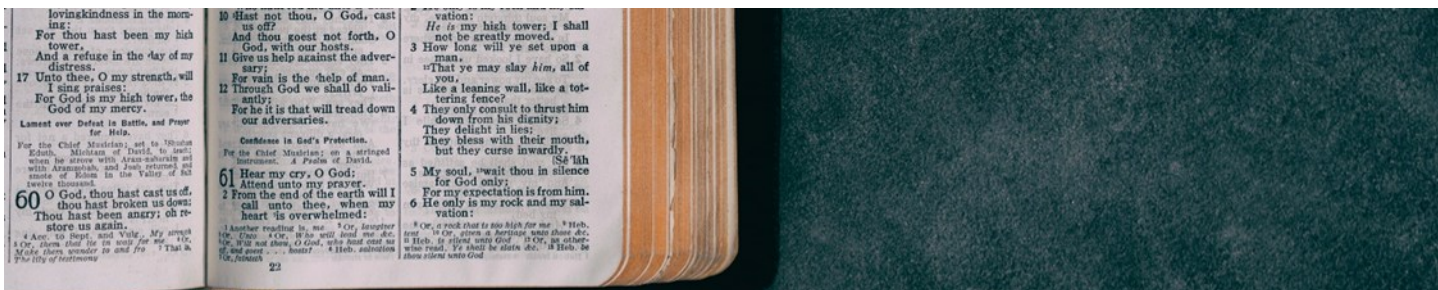

At the time of writing, the grand total is a ginormous whopping **£4,875.07!!** (including Gift Aid) We're exciting to send this money to our 2 partner organisations – Links and 100 Homes – who will both see lives changed and transformed through your generosity!

The start of a new year is always a time to look back and reflect on the past year. In so many ways it was a wonderful year in the life of our church. We had the largest group join our Alpha course at the start of the year, we baptised more people in the year than any other, we held our largest mini-conference with our great friends Paul and Perrienne from Texas, had our largest intake for Freedom in Christ – and so many stories of Jesus transforming lives in such a beautiful way.



We were also able to celebrate (finally!) the approval of our Planning Permission – to give us the green light to raise the necessary funds for our new building! 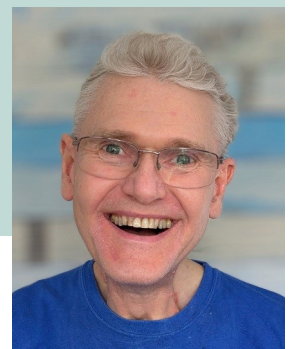

Two years since launching our regional hub in Kenya, we've seen amazing growth—both in the team and in community impact. We've even added dairy cows to support an income-generating project for the hub!

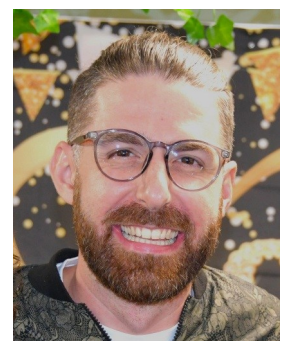
In November, we hosted 14 African partner organisations at the hub to learn and share ideas on agriculture, mental health, and IT—resources they'll take back to strengthen their communities.

Recently, our partnership helped launch eight new businesses for women at Kuwala Church and trained four young people in bricklaying—a skill they'll pass on to others.

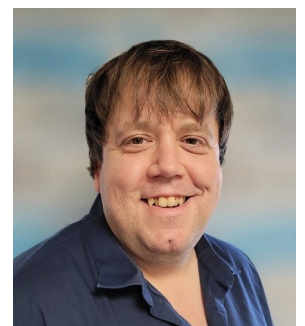

We have been running the Freedom in Christ (FIC) course for many years and had over 80 different people attend the course over the past 4 years! And we've run it again this year and it's been amazing to see what God has been doing.

We know that the course does not solve everything and that it can actually be

quite painful at times engaging with the teaching material, depending on the hurts we may have experienced in our lives. But we know that this course has been instrumental in helping people to identify negative thought patterns, to help take our thoughts captive and renew our minds. We've seen people develop amazing connections and friendships through mixing with other people across church and being vulnerable in a safe space.

So glad I took that step!

My name is Maureen Ndururi, and I love God—and I know He loves me a lot.

Now, I didn't always know this the way I know it now. That realisation really hit me when I joined the Freedom in Christ (FIC) course.

It's not that I didn't know God loves me before. I knew it... but I didn't know it, you know? Like that saying, "when you know, you know." Yeah—that kind of

knowing. I hope that makes sense.

That's why I'm giving this testimony—because of what this course has done in my life.

I first heard about FIC when the lovely Emmeline shared about it in church with so much passion and excitement. I thought, "Okay, why not?" I decided to give it a try, not really knowing what to expect, but trusting that He who began a good work in me would finish it.

And honestly, I'm so glad I took that step.



Every week, I learned something new. Some things I had heard before, but being in that class - and intentionally asking the Lord to open my eyes and ears - made all the difference. Every session came with a new insight or a small “aha!” moment. Scripture started making more sense, and I began to see my life in Christ in a completely new way.

Thanks to Freedom in Christ, I now know who I am in Christ. I know that God doesn't love me less when I'm not perfect (which is great news!) and above all I'm learning to live from freedom, not pressure—and that has changed everything.

Some things I am still learning and unlearning, thanks to this amazing eye-opening course. If I had one word to describe the whole experience it would be “IMPACTFUL”



I would like to thank the Ashwood Church team who made this possible, and to all my classmates who made the class and group discussions so much fun, I got to meet a lot of wonderful people.

May we all continue to experience Freedom in Christ!

Freedom in Christ - there's always more...

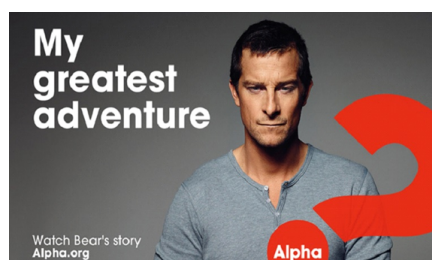
- I put on the belt of Truth: Jesus is my Way, my Truth, my Life - the only way to true living.

4. **JESUS CENTRED** – We want to be a community of people who know the truth of Jesus and live by His Spirit. Prayer, sharing God's word and exercising the gifts of the Spirit are all part of keeping Jesus unashamedly at the centre of all we are about.

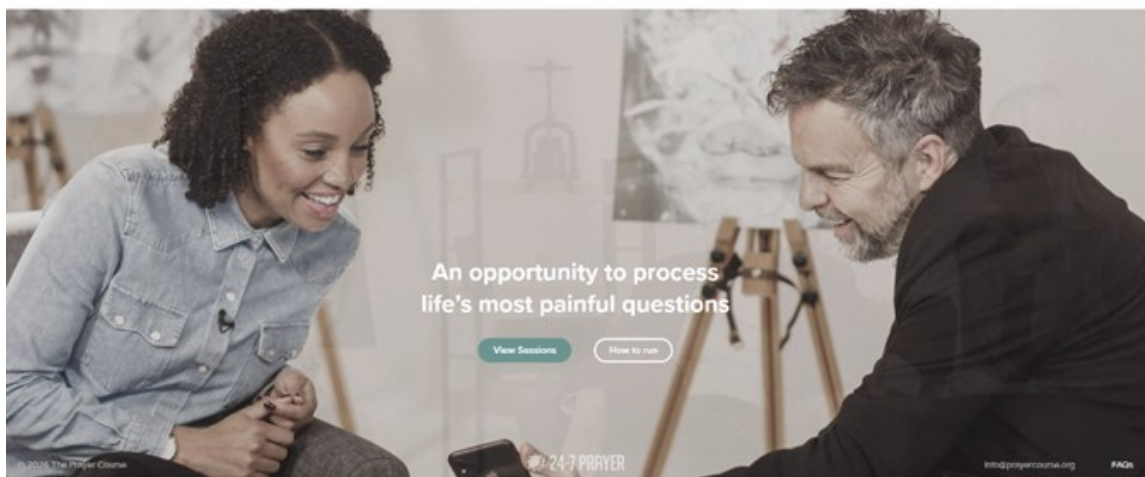


to be: welcoming, relational, Jesus centred and a place to grow!

Pastoral Visiting Team

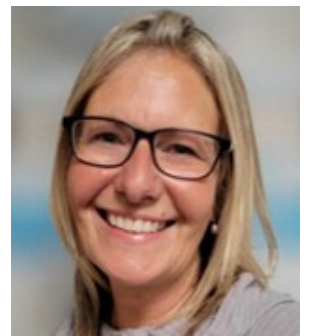
Many of you know that we have a team that will be available to visit those who are in hospital or chronically ill at home. This is primarily for adults who are within or connected to the church.

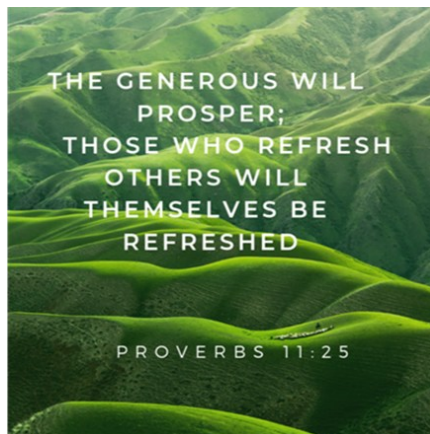

The last two months of the year have been full of fun, faith, and festive excitement at ACE Kids!

November Friday Night Takeaway – Jesus, the Greatest Gift

On Friday 28th November, our Friday Night Takeaway focused on the true meaning of Christmas. With the big idea that “Christmas is about God’s love — Jesus is the best gift ever!”, we explored John 3:16: “For God so loved the world that He gave His one and only Son.”

Abby brought the Christmas message to life with a creative sketch, playing a

December Virtual Christmas Assembly – The Grinch and God’s Love

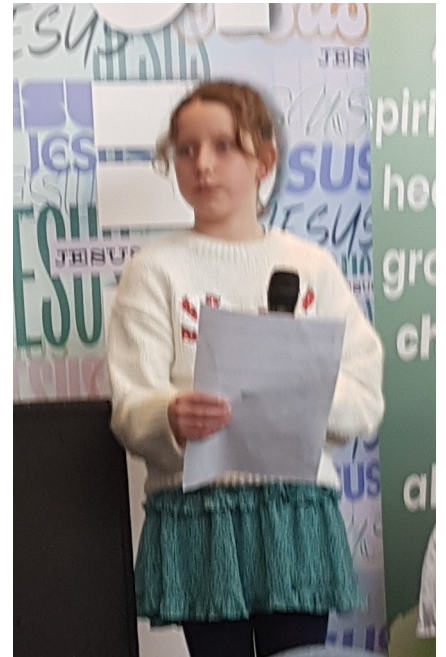

We put out the call, and you responded with remarkable generosity.

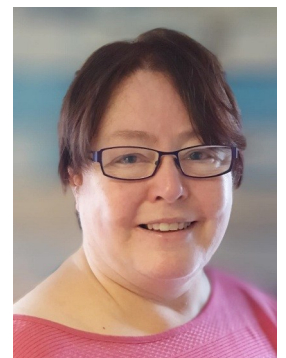

We are passionate about children and young people!

We want them to grow up in an environment where they can learn about Jesus and understand God's love for them. We want to equip our children and young people to meet Jesus and have a life long relationship with him.

Here are some of the great examples of ways we have been able to invest in the lives of children and young people with the money you have given. Every gift, small or large, makes a difference.

Since February 2025 we have:

- Run and resourced **six Friday Night Takeaway (FNT)** events for school years 1 to 6 (FNT is a great night of fun, games, music, food and stories. Each event enables children to learn more about Jesus). **The next FNT is on Friday 13th February 2026**

- Run and resourced **one holiday club** (during October half term) for school



years 1 to 6. (Each holiday club has a different theme which explores different aspects of life with a positive message

and story from the Bible)

- Run and provided materials, activities and refreshments for our Sunday morning '**Earthshakers**' groups (for ages 2 – 14)

- Facilitated **training** opportunities for our Children and Youth Teams
- Run **social events** for our young people including the Colour Run in August 2025
- Hosted and resourced our **Elevate youth** sessions on Friday evenings (these sessions have included Youth Alpha)
- Purchased **graduation gifts** for our young people graduating from Sunday morning Earthshakers groups into the main meeting
- Purchased **new tablets** to help with the registration for Earthshakers and ACE Kids events
- Invested in **Elevate Refresh** (our Youth weekend away for school years 6 to age 18) event. The next **Elevate Refresh will take place in July 2026**. (We subsidise the weekend to keep the costs as low as possible.)

It is so important to keep our children and young people connected and engaged with Jesus. Thank you for the money you give which helps us to try and do this. Everything we do is connected to our mission to help people find and follow Jesus!

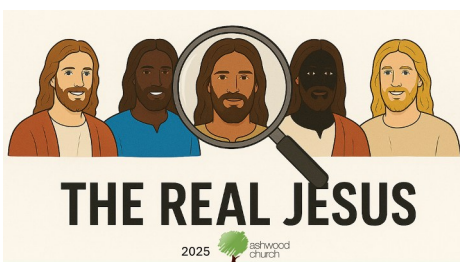
